Captain Moonlite's curious legacy

Greendale was once home to Captain Moonlite's Church, built with gold stolen by the infamous bushranger and lay preacher Andrew George Scott. Though he never preached there, the story lives on. In a remarkable twist, Captain Moonlite's request to be buried with his companion James Nesbitt was honoured in 1995, after letters between the two were discovered – a poignant moment in LGBTQIA+ history.
