




Telford Park All Abilities Sculpture Trail

Take a moment to slow down and enjoy the All Abilities Sculpture Trail at Telford Park in Darley, Bacchus Marsh. This 1.8km trail winds gently up the slope of the park, leading to the stunning Indigenous sculpture *Binak Biik* also known as Basket Country.

Created by Aunty Kim Wandin and Chris Joy, *Binak Biik* invites tactile exploration through woven baskets, native plants, and basalt rocks that reflect the unique geology of the Western Plains.

 The trail loops around the park with plenty of spots to sit, relax, and take in the surroundings. Whether you're up for a short stroll or a longer walk, there are options to suit your pace.

 At the centre of the trail is a lookout mound where the sculpture is located, a peaceful place to reflect and connect with the landscape.






How to get there
