Home to the spectacular Lal Lal Falls, this scenic destination offers a perfect blend of natural beauty, cultural heritage, and historic intrigue. The name Lal Lal comes from the Wuthaurung word meaning “dashing of waters”, a fitting tribute to the breathtaking waterfall that awaits.

Explore the falls and beyond

The Lal Lal Falls Reserve is a fantastic spot for a day out, especially after recent rainfall when the falls are at their most impressive.

Visitors can:

- Follow the trail to the Moorabool Falls viewing platform
- Enjoy BBQ facilities, picnic tables, a playground, and walking trails

From sheep runs to gold rush glory

Established in 1845 as part of a sheep run, Lal Lal quickly grew into a thriving mining community. The town's popularity soared thanks to horse racing, especially the New Year's Day Picnic Race Meeting, which was so beloved that a branch railway line was built to carry racegoers directly to the track. Though the last race was held in the 1930s, visitors can still explore:

- The historic racecourse
- The Lal Lal railway station
- Remnants of the town's mining past
