Storm debris for firewood and mulch

Moorabool Shire Council has commenced the processing of storm vegetation debris into unseasoned split firewood. Once this has been completed and sufficient stockpiles are available, firewood and mulch will be offered to the community in controlled quantities via a booking system. Further updates will be provided in coming weeks. Keep your eyes peeled.

Rory will be commencing on the Storm Recovery Team on Monday 4th October as our Community Engagement Officer: His focus will be on engaging and liaising with the community throughout the recovery process so keep an eye out for him as he does some fantastic work throughout the area in the coming months.







We are very happy to report that all council managed Fire Access Tracks across the Shire have now been cleared for emergency vehicles. Council has been working alongside DELWP to clear the Cricket Ground Track in Blakeville that sits across land managed by both. Trees may still fall on tracks after works have been completed. Please call the Council Emergency Recovery Number on 5366 1323 if you see a fire track that needs to be cleared. Vehicles can now enter this track, however there is still storm debris to be cleared on the road edges.



Work is ongoing to clear Fire Access Tracks on land managed by DELWP and Parks Victoria by the beginning of fire season. About 43% of these roads have been cleared and we expect this figure to continue to rapidly increase as crews use heavy machinery to remove hazardous trees.
