

## June 9-10 Storm Event 2021 – Community Newsletter No. 18

### October rain event

Along with much of the state, Moorabool Shire has been hit with heavy rainfall this month, peaking on Thursday 13 October. A total of 90-100mm of rain is estimated to have fallen during the event. Flash flooding occurred in townships right across the Shire and multiple roads were closed.

In order to assist residents to prepare for the deluge, Council opened free sand bagging stations at the Ballan Council office and Bacchus Marsh Council depot.

We thank the entire Moorabool community for their resilience and community mindedness during the floods, especially as many continue to recover from the lasting impacts of the June 2021 major storm event.

We would also like to thank Council staff, emergency services personnel and volunteers (including VICSES and CFA crews) and Victoria Police for their tireless work throughout the severe weather event.

The Bureau of Meteorology has advised that the coming weeks may continue to be wet, with unpredictable weather. Please practice caution and look after one another. Some roads across the Shire are still closed, so drive with caution and avoid areas with known closures. ## Central Highlands Storm Recovery and Heavy Rain Event Update from DELWP

Due to recent heavy rainfall events, roadside storm debris works are currently on hold in the Wombat and Cobaw State Forests. DELWP and VicForests are working to commence operations as soon as conditions allow but are currently anticipating delays of up to several weeks.

Although the following sites are not ready to re-open, DELWP has contractors working on the following:

- Whipstick Walk
- Lerderderg River Heritage Walk
- Grate Dividing Trail.

DELWP crews will be starting work on both Nolans Creek Picnic Area and the Lyonville Springs Picnic Area shortly. This work includes replacing bollards with rocks, repairing BBQs, replacing tables where required, reforming paths and placing grass seed.

Following recent large rainfall events DELWP is reminding residents and visitors to be careful when driving in State Forests. These recent events have caused significant damage to tracks and roads creating an increased risk to drivers.

Many of the roads in our State Forests have been severely damaged and will remain closed until works can be completed. This goes for campgrounds as well, as they are not a safe place to rest at the moment.

DELWP strongly advises people not to visit campgrounds until the surrounding tracks have dried out.

Primary Producer Clean-up and Relief Grants are now available for farmers impacted by the floods.

This \$10,000 grant will help farmers pay for the cost of the clean-up and get their businesses up and running again.

Grants can be used to cover a range of expenses including removing and disposing of rubbish, replacing or repairing damaged equipment and fencing as well as purchasing fodder and water.

## Free green waste drop-off for fire season preparation

Moorabool Shire residents can drop off green waste for free at any of the Shire's transfer stations for the month of November to prepare their property for the 2022/23 fire season.

The service is being introduced in response to community feedback from over 700 community contributions to Moorabool's Waste and Resource Recovery Strategy 2030.

There is no restriction on the volume of green waste dropped off. Residents will be required to show proof of residency such as a driver's licence or utility bill.

To be fire-season ready, clear the following green waste from your property:

- Undergrowth and fallen branches
- Leaves from gutters
- Grass

Please note: tree stumps and branches over 200mm in diameter will not be accepted within this service. Residents must ensure green waste is not mixed with household garbage, building materials, recyclables, or any other contaminant.

In addition to the green waste service, Moorabool residents are reminded that free recycling for e-waste, whitegoods, batteries, scrap metal and recyclables accepted in the yellow lid kerbside bin is available at the transfer stations throughout the year.
