Travel Instructions

The closest bus stop to the Lerderderg Library is the Bacchus Marsh Village/Bennett Street interchange on Bennett Street. Bus routes <u>433</u>, <u>434 and 435</u> all stop at this interchange. Bus routes <u>433</u>, <u>434 and 435</u> all travel between the interchange and Bacchus Marsh Railway Station.

The pathway between Lerderderg Library and the Bennett Street interchange is mostly flat with a travel distance of approximately 450m.

Toilet Location

Lerderderg Library has one accessible bathroom which is publicly available whilst the Library is open. This bathroom is located adjacent to the James Young meeting rooms in the breakout area of the Library. The bathroom is a Left-Hand Transfer all-gender bathroom and is large enough to manoeuvre a wheelchair. There are no steps to access this bathroom

The closest Marveloo is stationed at the <u>Andy Arnold Centre in Bennett Street Bacchus</u> Marsh.

Accessible Parking

There are two designated parking spaces in the vicinity of Lerderderg Library. One is located outside the Bacchus Marsh Public Hall (approx. 40 metres from Lerderderg Library). The other is located in the carpark at the rear of the Village Green (approx. 120 metres from Lerderderg Library).

There are also two designated disability parking spaces in the carpark outside The Elms Medical Centre (rear of the UFS Pharmacy and Post Office) (approx. 220 metres from Lerderderg Library)

Wheelchair Access

The Lerderderg Library is completely wheelchair accessible.

Recharge Point

Lerderderg Library has two Electric mobility scooter/wheelchair recharge points. One can be found in the entry foyer of the Library to the right of the AED station. The second point can be found to the right of the large window facing out to the corner of Main Street and Lord Street inside the Library.

Hearing Loop

A Hearing Loop is installed at the Library and Council Customer Service desks.
